A participatory research report on community food security in Nova Scotia*.

**On page 13, the following sentence should be corrected to read:**

The bulk of this seafood, however, is consumed outside of Nova Scotia, with 112,472 tonnes exported in 2010<sup>9</sup> compared with 22,000 tonnes<sup>9a</sup> being consumed annually in-province (not necessarily locally harvested).
